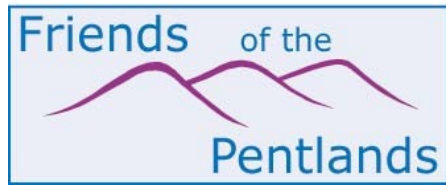

- 1) To protect and enhance the natural beauty and upland character of the Pentland Hills, its waters and surrounding countryside, declaring that 'the Pentlands' shall mean the Pentland Hills and surrounding countryside.
- 2) To protect and enhance the natural and cultural heritage and features of public amenity within this area.
- 3) To encourage respect for the quality of life of those who live and work within this area.
- 4) To carry out environmental projects that enhances public access and biodiversity.
- 5) To encourage high standards of design in all work undertaken within this area.
- 6) To provide an annual programme of activities to foster the enjoyment of healthy exercise, an appreciation of the environment and social and cultural history.

7) To promote the forming of appropriate planning policies, compatible with these purposes, through the considered long term development plan process and their effective and consistent implementation.

8) To stimulate public interest in these proposals by means of publications, meetings, exhibitions, appeals and other forms of publicity.

9) To co-operate with other bodies to promote the foregoing purposes.

Friends of the Pentlands has a programme of walks proposed for 2013. It also has a programme of project works in the Pentlands which includes path improvement works, the installation of bird and bat boxes, the planting of trees and wildflowers, the installation of interpretive panels, the development of a wildflower meadow and the planting of an arboretum consisting of trees that are found in the Pentland Hills. Work will commence in establishing a Pentland Way route from the South West to Swanston. It is also committed to maintain the Harlaw wildlife garden and other maintenance activities. Friends of the Pentlands also programmes workdays to suit future projects as they occur. The nest box camera, wildflower planting and the purchase of bat boxes etc. are financed by our very successful Tea and Cakes Days at Harlaw Visitor Centre
